

Nearby Attractions

- **Bon Monastery: 15 Minutes by Car**
 - Embark on a spiritual journey like no other at the enchanting Bon Monastery in Dolanji. Discover centuries-old wisdom within the walls of one of the oldest Menri Monasteries, now a thriving hub of spiritual learning and devotion. With its serene surroundings and the opportunity to witness authentic rituals, a visit to the Bon Monastery promises an unforgettable experience that resonates with the soul.
- **Ruge Ka Khatta: 1 Hour by Car**
 - Massive ground that offers panoramic views of Shimla and Churdhar Peak. The ground is plush with snow during winters.
- **Chillarur Trek: 1 Minutes by Car**
 - Ideal Trek for beginners that culminates with enigmatic views and visit to a buddhist temple.
- **Jatoli Shiv Temple: 12 Minutes by Car**
 - Tallest Shiva temple in Asia, with unique sound-producing stones, 122-foot height, 39-year community-built marvel, mythological legacy, and healing water.
- **Ashwani Khad Waterfall: 2 Hours 15 Minutes by Car**
 - Ashwani Khad waterfall is a beautiful hidden waterfall. It's a refreshing place where you can step into the water and take a bath. Ideal for picnics, meditation and games.
- **Giripul: 32 Minutes by Car**
 - Giripul is one of the hidden gems of Himachal Pradesh. Ideal for riverside picnics, meditation and games.
- **Karol Tibba Trek: 34 Minutes by Car**
 - The Karol Tibba trek is an accessible 11-kilometer route leading to the Goddess Kali temple atop the peak. It offers a diverse terrain experience, transitioning from brick pathways to picturesque grasslands and finally forest trails, passing by the ancient Pandava Cave. This trek offers breathtaking panoramic views of Solan city, Shimla city, and Churdhar peak.
- **Mohan Shakti National Heritage park: 1 Hour by Car**
 - An urban oasis featuring gardens, recreational areas, a temple and spaces for walkers, families, senior citizens, and yoga enthusiasts. Ideal location for bird watching.
- **Shoolini Temple: 29 Minutes by Car**
 - An ancient sanctuary in Solan where the goddess of strength and prosperity is worshipped; immerse in spirituality amidst

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stunning landscapes, join lively festivals, and experience the enchantment

- **Dagshai Jail Museum: 48 Minutes by Car**
 - Historic prison turned museum, built in 1847 at 6,087 feet above sea level; witness to Mahatma Gandhi's presence, housed inmates like Nathuram Godse, displays 54 cells, and offers unique insights into its history and architecture.
- **Shimla: 2 Hours By Car**
 - Nestled at an elevation of 2159 m above sea level, Shimla, named after Goddess Shyamala, offers a serene escape despite its powerful namesake. Positioned in the southern part of Himachal Pradesh, it's a city of allure, blending natural beauty with man-made wonders. Discovered by the British in 1819, it transformed from a Nepalese village to a fashionable summer retreat and the summer capital of India. The heart of Shimla is the vibrant Mall, joined by the Ridge, housing landmarks like the Vice-Regal Lodge, Christ Church, and Jhaku Temple. With its rich history and diverse attractions, Shimla beckons between September and November for a remarkable getaway.
- **Kasauli: 1 Hour by Car**
 - This small hill station seems to live in time warp that belongs to the 19th century. The narrow roads of Kasauli (1951m) slither up and down the hillside and offer some magnificent vistas. Directly below is the spread of vast plains of Punjab and Haryana which as darkness falls, unroll a gorgeous carpet of twinkling lights. Places to visit in Kasauli are The Monkey Point, Baba Balak Nath Temple, Shirdi Sai Baba Temple, Christ and Baptist church and Lawrence School.
- **Chail: 1 Hour 30 Minutes by Car (Scenic Route)**
 - Chail is a very famous place of Himachal Pradesh. The Chail Palace is well known for its architecture, the palace was built as a summer retreat by the Maharaja of Patiala during the British Raj. Chail is connected with Solan as well as with Shimla District Headquarter. It is 49 kms from Shimla and 38 Kms from solan. There are places to visit Chail are The Palace Chail, Cricket Ground, Kali Tibba and Hanuman Temple.

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- **Daro ki Dhar: 1 Hour 10 Minutes by Car**
 - Nestled atop a serene mountain, this quaint village offers picturesque vistas and tranquility. The village boasts charming walking trails leading to fields, flower plantations, and mushroom farms. Additionally, a lesser-known hiking trail leads to an ancient abandoned fort, believed to be over 500 years old. The hike through the forest takes merely 30 minutes, rewarding hikers with a 360° panoramic view of the surrounding mountains from the fort's summit. - **Subathu: 1 Hour 25 Minutes by Car**
 - When the 'Gurkha Wars' came to an end in 1815-16, Subathu grew steadily in importance. This was where the newly appointed British Political Agent to the Hill States was initially based and this was a major stopover on the old road to Shimla; the 'old road' rose from Kalka straight up to Kasauli, went past the Lawrence School at Sanawar and dropped down to Subathu via Dharampur, this then went past the villages of Sairi and Kakkarhatti to reach Shimla. Subathu, right from the early years, was a major recruitment center for Gurkhas in the British Indian army. When Shimla became the summer capital, Governors' Generals / Viceroys of India rode up on horse-back and Subathu was the natural midway staging post. This is now the Regimental Center of the Indian army for Gurkhas. At an altitude of 1265 mtr.
- **Arki: 2 Hour 40 Minutes by Car**
 - Arki was the capital of the princely hill state of Baghal, which was founded by Rana Ajai Dev, a Panwar Rajput. The state was founded around 1643 and Arki was declared its capital by Rana Sabha Chand in 1650. The Arki Fort is a converted hotel and lovely to visit. The Arki Fort was built between 1800 and 1805 by Rana Prithvi Singh, a descendent of Sabha Chand. The fort was captured by the Gurkhas in 1806. Arki is 50 kms from Solan and 43 kms from Shimla HQ.
